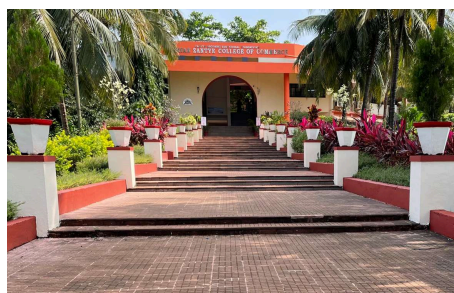

Research Methodology and Literature Search PRAYoG - Phase-I

A special session on “Research Methodology and Literature Search” was organized for the T.Y.B.Com students on Saturday, 27th September at 10 am at the college seminar hall. The objective of the session was to familiarise students with the fundamentals of research, systematic approaches to data collection, and effective techniques for literature review.

The session was conducted by Prof. (Dr.) Mahesh Majik from the RDI cell, Directorate of Higher Education, Goa. He highlighted the importance of research in academic and professional growth. The resource person explained the key steps involved in research methodology, including problem identification, formulation of objectives, hypothesis framing, data collection and analysis. Emphasis was laid on the role of ethical practices in research and the necessity of maintaining originality.

A major part of the session focused on literature search techniques. Students were introduced to various academic databases, e-journals, and open educational resources. Practical tips were given on how to identify relevant sources, use keywords effectively and evaluate the credibility of references. The session also covered citation methods and the importance of avoiding plagiarism.

The session was highly interactive, with students actively participating in discussions and clarifying doubts regarding projects. The practical demonstrations on searching academic resources were particularly appreciated by the participants.

In conclusion, the session proved to be insightful and beneficial for the T.Y.B.Com students. It not only enhanced their understanding of research methodology but also equipped them with essential skills to conduct literature searches effectively. The knowledge gained will help them in undertaking academic projects and future research endeavours. A total of 87 T.Y. B.Com students (46 girls and 41 boys) and 17 faculty members attended the session.

The resource person emphasized practical usage and real-time applications of these tools. The workshop was highly informative and interactive, equipping students with valuable skills to integrate AI into their academic and professional work. Students appreciated the practical demonstrations and expressed enthusiasm to use these features in their studies.

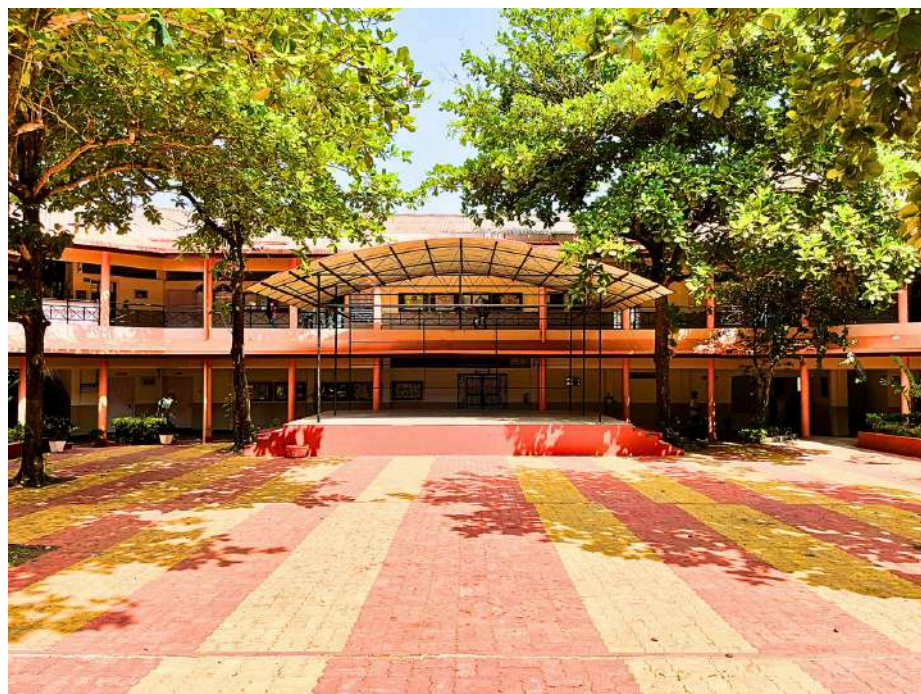
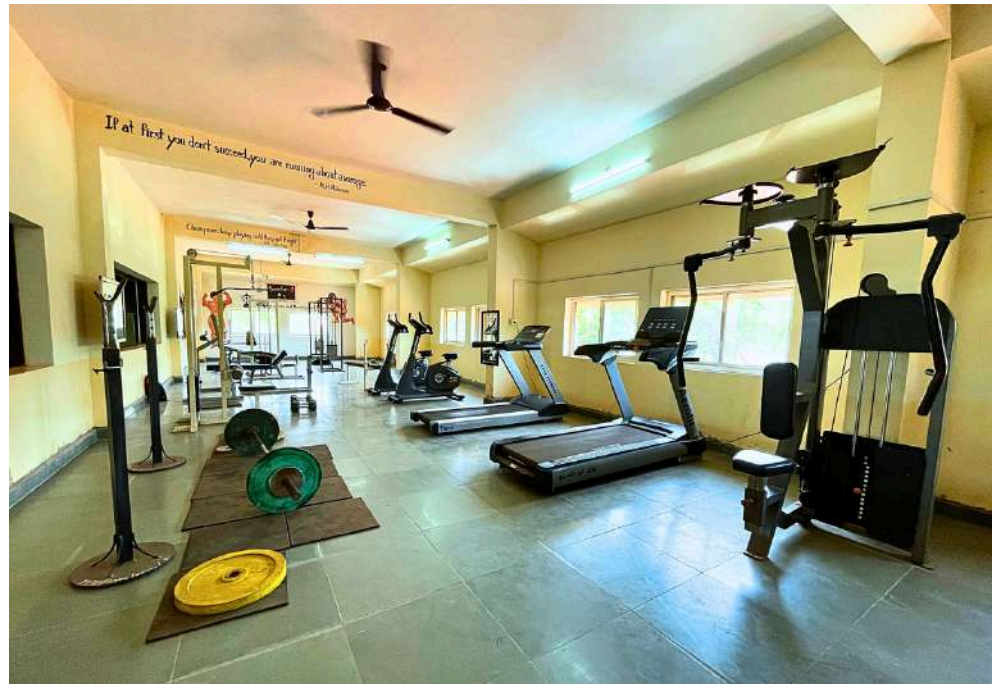

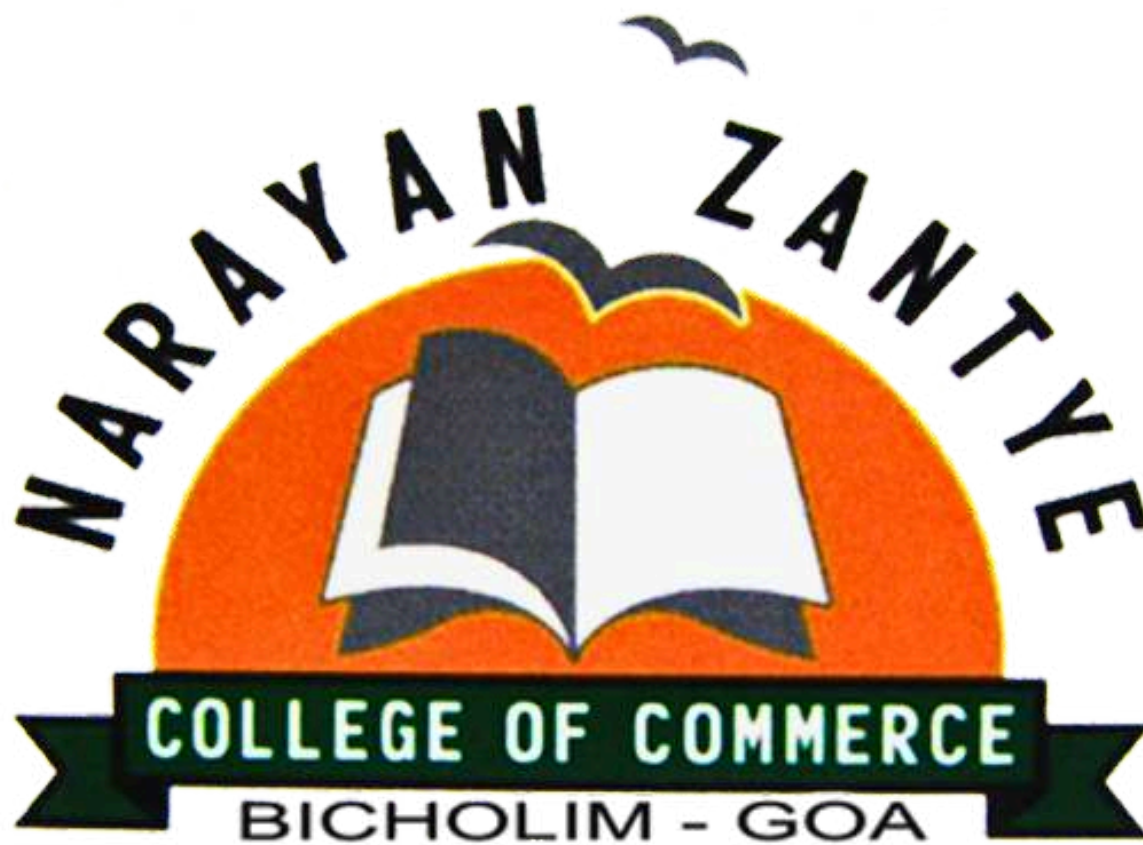
